Leave your mark at Mount Bethel Cemetery, while ensuring that the memory of your loved ones will be a part of our lasting history. A restored brick pathway in the northeast corner will lead visitors the most historic section of the cemetery. The original "Brick Graveyard" is the final resting place of Susanna Wright's family, a Conestoga Indian and our founding fathers. The first burial was John Deval, who "dyed" at the age of 17, in 1730.

Mount Bethel Cemetery offers individuals a meaningful way to honor those both living and deceased through our "Bricks for the Brickyard", in which any member of the public can sponsor one or more preferred bricks, for the walking path. In turn, sponsors receive the rights to personalize their brick(s) with the names of their parents, children, family, friends or beloved pets. Bricks can also be customized to include quotes and messages that may bear special meaning to the sponsor in question.
